The Valentine's Day Dance-A-Thon is coming to Adam Beck JPS on Wednesday February 14th, 2018. It will be an all day event in the GYM. All Kindergarten – Grade 6 classes will be coming to the Dance-A-Thon for a period at a time to celebrate and dance. The purpose of the Dance-A-Thon is to celebrate Valentine's Day and raise money for the X-movement program/technology at our school. The Dance-A-Thon envelopes are to be returned no later than Wednesday February 14th, 2018. We will even have prizes and raffles! Parents are invited to join in the fun as a schedule will be provided closer to the Dance-A-Thon. As you walk through the school hallways you will see the Kindergartens working on Surveys about Winter Clothing and Inquiry based learning on Trees! Grades 1 & 2 – Fairy Tale Reader Theatre, Geometric Art, Rhyming Poetry, Procedural Writing and Structures. Grade 3s – Soils and Environment, Grade 4s – Light and Sound, Forces, Non-Fiction Texts and Newspaper Articles, Grade 5s – First Nations & Early Explorers & Conservation of Energy, Grade 6s – Tamarac Books from Forest of Reading and "Les bandes dessinnées". Also, as always, students are keeping healthy in Phys. Ed. through Co-operative Games & Basketball.

In Integrated Arts - Kindergartens are exploring the BEAT in music using drums and their bodies;

- The Gr. 1 and 1/2 classes have been exploring the pitch of music using the xylophones.

- The Gr. 2 and 2/3 classes are practicing the "Do Re Mi" hand signs and creating dances to accompany the famous song from "The Sound of Music".

- Gr. 3 and 3/4 classes have been learning about different kinds of music instruments and creating dances that show different kinds of storms in nature.

- The Gr. 4/5 classes are combining their scientific and arts knowledge to create dances that show water changing through it's various forms.

- The Gr. 5/6 classes have been learning to play "The Lion Sleeps Tonight" on the xylohpones and now are creating a dance to accompany the song!

Oh.... and Choir Rehearsals have begun for the Marlies game and the Spring Concert!

Report Cards and Interviews

Please note that Grade 1-6 report cards and the Junior Kindergarten Summaries will be coming home with your child/children on Tuesday February 13th. CCAT results will also be sent home with Grade 3 Report Cards for students who participated in the CCAT process. Kindergarten teachers will be scheduling meetings with parents of JK students. Grades 1-6 Teachers will ask to meet with parents with the following criteria:

Parents and guardians are invited for parent/guardian-teacher conference this term in the following circumstances:

- * Students who are or may be at risk for promotion to the next grade
- * Students whose placement in an alternative (e.g., French Immersion) or Special Education program is being considered
- * Students whose achievement has declined significantly
- * In addition, if a parent would like to request a meeting with a teacher to discuss their child's progress, they can also do so



February 19 – Statutory Holiday

There will be no classes on Monday, February 19, 2018 to reflect the province-wide statutory holiday called Family Day. The holiday occurs on the third Monday in February of each year for the purpose of emphasizing and celebrating the importance of families taking time to be together.

Because teachers are involved in professional learning on Friday, February 16 for the Board wide Professional Activity Day, students will not be attending school on Friday, February 16 and Monday, February 19 which is the statutory holiday - Family Day.

Kindergarten Registration 2018

Kindergarten is the first step in a lifelong journey that will see your child learn, grow, and succeed at the Toronto District School Board. At the TDSB, we know early learners learn best through doing; so our four and five year olds are introduced to math and science through play as part of K-12 STEM programming. To inspire a love for learning, kindergarten classrooms are bustling with inquiry and exploration through science activities, math games, art projects and more.

To attend Junior Kindergarten in September 2018, children must turn four-years-old by December 31, 2014. To register for Senior Kindergarten, children must be five-years-old by December 31, 2013. All of our schools now offer Full-Day Kindergarten where students will attend Kindergarten for the entire school day. This includes a morning and afternoon schedule and a lunch break. - 1) Proof of age (a birth certificate or baptismal record, passport or proof of citizenship) 2) Proof of address (two pieces of identification that show your address, such as your utility bill, bank
- statement, income tax form, rental or lease agreement) 3) Immunization (folder that shows a list of needles your child has received) 4) Health Card

Safe Arrival Automated Call Out System

Just a friendly reminder, parents are encouraged to call the school by 8:00 am or 12:30 pm each day if your child will be late or absent. Families will receive an automated call if they do not call the school to inform us of an absence or late arrival.

Making the Best of Winter Weather at our School Principals are often asked how we decide whether it's too cold to allow our students out in the schoolyard for recess.



Fresh air and exercise are important for children. It keeps them physically fit, and helps them stay alert all through the school day. Parents can help by making sure their children come to school prepared to spend time outdoors. Hats, mitts, boots and a warm jacket are important to keep students comfortable during lunch and recess. But extreme cold can be dangerous, and parents want to know that their children will be safe. When the temperature is predicted to drop below -15C, the City of Toronto may declare a cold weather alert. Schools are very sensitive to the needs of our students and pay close attention to the weather, especially when the wind chill is below -20 C.




The TDSB Severe Weather Protocol is flexible, so that every principal can make a decision that meets the needs of his or her school. It sets guidelines for when to allow students outside for recess, when to make outdoor breaks shorter, and when to keep students inside altogether.
