### **Minutes of Last Meeting**

**MOTION**: It was moved by Lisa Telio and seconded by Michelle Grahlman that the minutes of the school council meeting of February 22, 2018 be approved as presented. <u>The motion was passed unanimously</u>.

### **Principal's Report**

Mr. Yee tabled the Principal's report. Highlights of his report include:

• 2018-2019 school organization and staffing model

- The number of students enrolled in kindergarten for next school year is higher than previous years and higher than anticipated by TDSB forecasting. Staffing resources have been adjusted by TDSB accordingly.
- The list of English and French immersion classes for the next school year will be sent home and is available on school council website <u>here</u>.
- Student class placements will begin soon with discussions between teachers and school administration discussing the needs of each student while balancing numbers, gender, abilities, strengths, needs and social dynamics.
- A <u>letter</u> has been sent home to invite parents to submit in writing any considerations they want the school to consider in the placement of their child. The feedback is optional and is for consideration only.
- Upcoming events
  - Junglesport is underway and is very well received by students (and parents!);
  - Earth week is in full swing. Funds raised by the students will be donated to <u>Raincoast Conservation</u>
    <u>Foundation</u> to help save ocean animals
    - Recycled art sculptures due April 23
    - Re-used book sale April 25, please drop off books by April 24 to the class
    - School grounds and neighborhood clean-up April 26
  - Grade 6 Ottawa trip is April 25-27; the trip includes visits to museums, historic sites and downtown Ottawa;
  - Spring Concert is on May 3; it will feature kindergarten students, primary and junior choir and string band;
  - Grade 4-5 students participate in the TDESSA South Conference Track and Field Meet at Birchmount Stadium;
  - Ultimate Frisbee tournament for grades 4, 5 and 6 is taking place in late May;
  - Grade 3 and 6 will be writing the EQAO in late May. Participation of all students in the testing is very important, parents are encouraged to ensure students are able to participate in the testing;
  - Eco-team is organizing a clothing exchange at June Fest. Please drop clean, gently used children's clothing at the Office on June 6 and 7. Leftover clothing will be donated to charity.

# **Committee Updates**

### **Treasurer's report**

Julie Middleton provided an overview of school council revenue and expenses to date.

- Requests for proposals for the next year's school council budget are due April 27. Parents and teachers are encouraged to submit proposals for initiatives that they would like to champion and that require money from school council budget to run.
- The budget committee will meet twice in May to review the proposals and draft the budget which will be presented at the June meeting of the school council.

### **Visiting Artists Committee**

Michelle Lavoie reported that the project scale has changed due to increased costs of supplies and availability of artist to run the program.

- Inner City Angels who were initially proposed as the art partner for this initiative are no longer available.
- Another artist has been identified to run this program, he is TDSB approved and has a lot of experience.
- The project will use higher quality paint to ensure its longer life;
- The project will use simpler plywood cutouts but higher plywood quality;

- The project will require less volunteer support than originally planned;
- Given changes in the project outlined above, the Faces on the Fence program will now be offered to Grade 3-6 students (originally planned for Grade 1-6) and a Prologue performance will be offered to students kindergarten to grade 2).

#### Night on the Beach

- Michelle Grahlman reported on behalf of Jennifer Starr
- Planning for the event is well underway;
- Wristbands and tickets are available for purchase through <u>www.munchalunch.com</u> and at the door;
- The event will include silent auction, a photo booth, games, music and dance;
- Lisa Telio will be the master of ceremonies for the evening.
