In keeping with Indigenous Protocol and building respectful relationships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal peoples in Canada, Ms. Scenna acknowledged the Traditional Territories/Ancestral Lands of Aboriginal peoples and read the treaty acknowledgement for William Treaties area (east of Woodbine Avenue).

Welcome and minutes of last meeting

Jeny Nussey welcomed the group and asked for a motion for the approval of the April 19, 2018 minutes.

MOTION:

It was moved by Karen McMullin and seconded by Julie Middleton that the minutes of the school council meeting of April 19, 2018 be approved as presented. <u>The motion was passed unanimously.</u>

Treasurer's Report

Julie Middleton gave an overview of the 2017-2018 revenue and expenses and introduced the 2018-2019 budget for the Adam Beck School Council. She reported that the budget committee (made of school council executive members who attended at least 5 out of 6 meetings of the school council this school year) met twice to: review the current year's revenue and expenditures; review the funding proposals brought forward by parents and teachers for next school year; and develop the 2018-2019 budget.

MOTION:

It was moved by Julie Middleton and seconded by Cristina Toporas that the Adam Beck School Council budget for the 2018-2019 school year proposed by the budget committee be approved as presented. The budget will be brought forward to the new parent school council at the September 2018 meeting. The motion was passed unanimously.

2018-2019 budget highlights (please refer to the attached budget document).

- The fundraising events for next year are the same as in 2017-2018. We reduced the revenue forecast based on results this year and low volunteer parent engagement. Night on the Beach does not yet have a lead.
- On the expense side, many programs are consistent with last year's budget. Adam Beck spirit events, Scientists in School, Read-a-Thon, Visiting Artists, STEM, Eco Club, Adopt-a-Family, Holiday Party, Rendezvous Café, the kindie butterfly program, and other programs will continue in 2018-2019 school year.

- New initiatives in in 2018-2019 budget are:
 - \$10,000 for purchase of in-class technology.
 - \$4,000 for the purchase of new musical instruments (flutes, clarinets, trumpets, drums, etc.).
 - \$3,000 to replace the sound system in the gym and \$2,000 to improve the stage lighting to benefit school performances.
 - \$5,600 for classroom resources support (\$200 per teacher to spend on non-TDSB funded classroom resources like books, art supplies, software).
 - \$650 for Rocks and Rinks a program presented by Curling Canada that introduces the Olympic sport of curling to kids.
 - Purchase and sale of Adam Beck branded water bottles, mugs, key chains and enamel pins.
 - \$2,300 to fund innovative, parent-led programs for students and/or the community that may come up during the school year. Recognizing that not all ideas are coming forward at budget time, school council wants to be able to consider such proposals throughout the year. Parents are invited to submit proposals like the ones required for the annual budget process and present them to the executive at a school council meeting.
 - \$1,000 to support a school council that has fewer resources than Adam Beck.

Mr. Yee commended the parent community and school council for their outstanding engagement and fundraising, and for their efforts to equitably address all areas of education in the school council budget. He encouraged more collaboration between teachers and committee leads to determine the content of the proposed education programs and suggested that one teacher be engaged in each school council committee, as appropriate. Mr. Yee asked that the administration be provided by school council with copies of the budget proposals submitted by teachers to ensure there is no overlap with initiatives that are or can be funded by TDSB through school budget. He thanked Jeny Nussey, Karen McMullin and Julie Middleton for their efforts this past school year.

Principal Update

Mr. Yee presented the Principal Update.

- Student BBQ was a success. Next year, the intent is to hire someone to mend the barbecue, it is a lot of work for staff. School Council can consider the same for Monsterbash and Mayfair.
- Friday June 22 is Inside out AB Spirit day.
- Report cards go home on June 26.
- Last day of school is Thursday, June 28, character education festivities planned.
- Congratulations to the school eco committee Adam Beck won platinum eco standard for a 2nd year in a row.
- X-movement Aussie games was very well received.
- There will be several new teachers next school year.
