Parents Taking Other Students Other Than Their Own For Lunch

Please remember that if you are making arrangements for the parent of another child to take your child out for lunch, we require a letter signed by you, the parent authorizing this, to be brought to the office and that individual needs to sign your child out for lunch. Please understand we are trying to maintain student safety and we need to be aware of these sorts of arrangements.

Lost & Found

A friendly reminder to the parents of our Kindergarten to Grade 6 students, particularly if your children stay for lunch to put on winter coats, snow pants, boots, mitts and hats. By taking some time at home to have your child develop these independent, self-help skills, they will feel more confident in getting themselves ready for outdoor play at recess time. Also, many children have similar outdoor clothes that make identifying their own belongings difficult. Labelling your child's shoes, boots, coats etc. with his/her initials is helpful. Please send an indoor pair of shoes to be kept at school since all children must have shoes on at all times for safety.

All parents, if you are looking for missing belongings ie. Sweaters, shoes, pants, and jackets Please come by and check the Lost and Found located outside the Office.

Extra- Curricular Activities

The Adam Beck staff are an amazing and dedicated group of individuals who generously give up their own personal time to provide as much extra-curricular activities as possible for our students. Staff make students aware of various opportunities through announcements and recess or lunch meetings during the school day. Staff expect interested students to demonstrate initiative and responsibility by remembering to come out to meetings if they want to be part of these opportunities.

PJ Day & Holiday Sing-A-Long

Don't forget that Friday December 21st is the last day before the winter break and we invite all students to wear their PJ's for a fun filled and relaxed day.

Pediculosis (Head Lice)

We ask all Adam Beck Parents to report any cases of lice directly to the office and take the following precautions:

- 1. Inspect your child's hair and scalp frequently. The louse may be brown or greyish, with a flat, wingless body 2-3 mm in length with six legs. The eggs may be yellow, brown, or white teardrop-shaped, are glued to the hair near the scalp and are called "nits". It is usually the eggs which are first noticed.
- 2. If your child complains of an itchy scalp, you should check for lice and/or nits.
- 3. If you discover your child has lice or nits, please notify the school right away and a Treatment Instruction sheet will be sent home.
- 4. Please note that if a child is found to have pediculosis, the parent or guardian will be required to keep the child at home until the child is free of all head lice and nits.
- 5. Upon returning to school after a case of head lice, parents must accompany their child to the office to be checked before they can be re-admitted to class.
- 6. Students will not be re-admitted unless they are all clear.

Dressing for the Weather

In addition, we ask that all students have a pair of indoor and outdoor shoes at school. This is extremely important in case we have to suddenly evacuate all students must wear shoes at all times inside the school.

EARLY FRENCH IMMERSION 2019-2020

You have a choice to make about French programming for your child.

Across the TDSB, we offer two programs: Early French Immersion (SK entry) and Junior Extended French (Gr.4 entry)

Senior Kindergarten is the ONLY time your child can begin the Early French Immersion program.

What is Early French Immersion?

Early French Immersion programs are designed for students who do not speak French at home. The Early French Immersion program provides the maximum French language experience available in our schools.

Early French Immersion begins in Senior Kindergarten. All class activities are conducted in French until the end of Grade 3 although some specialist subjects like Physical Education may be taught in English.

English is introduced in Grade 4 for about one hour per day and increases to half of the daily class time by Grade 6.

After Grade 8, students continue the French Immersion program at designated secondary schools. Students who successfully complete a minimum of 10 credits in French at the secondary school level are eligible for a Certificate of Bilingual Studies in French.

Applications for the Early French Immersion Program

are completed online for September 2019

Applications to the Early French Immersion program are made the year your child is in Junior Kindergarten for entry in September of Senior Kindergarten. It is an entirely online process. All communication will be sent via the email address you provide. Please check this email regularly.

Please visit the application site <u>www.tdsb.on.ca/pars</u>

✓ You will need your child's date of birth and OEN (Ontario Education Number).

The OEN is a 9-digit number found on any report card from the TDSB.

✓ For non-TDSB students, please select the "Non-TDSB Student" option and

follow the steps to generate an identification number. You must then return to the PARS site and follow the application procedure with this number.

✓ Please select Early French Immersion from the drop-down menu and complete

the application process.

On-time applicants will be offered a placement online via the email address you have provided. You MUST take action to accept this placement by the deadline requested when you are offered a placement.

Offers of placement will be on-going through the weeks and months following the close of the application period. Please check your email regularly (including junk mail) and follow all instructions found therein.

IMPORTANT DATES: Application process opens: October 29, 2018

Deadline for applications: November 26, 2018

Please note: while every effort will be made to place students in the school identified as their area Early French Immersion school, this is not always possible. In cases where the number of applications in a given area is greater than the number of spaces in the school, students may be redirected to schools with available space. Placements are made based on the address you provide prior to the application deadline. If your address changes between the application deadline and the fall of the SK year, there is no guarantee of placement in your new area.

Applicants who have older siblings currently enrolled in the program and who will be in attendance the following year have a priority placement in that school.

Classes with fewer than 25 students may not open.
