Minutes Review

MOTION: Shannon asked for approval of the April minutes. Julie proposed the motion and Mme Bettas seconded the motion. As there were none that were opposed and no edits proposed, the minutes were <u>passed</u>.

Committee Updates

- <u>Mayfair</u>: Michelle gave a thank you to committee members and volunteers. Excellent event. Happy with new vendor for bouncy castles. Approx \$14,900 raised in profit.
- Night on the Beach: Shannon gave an update on fantastic sold-out event. Approx \$12,000 raised in profit. Mme Bettas suggested art canvases process of bidding start on-line in future.
- Staff Appreciation: Christa Jay passed along the event on May 1st was lovely and much appreciated.
- Spirit: As part of school play day there will be a dance party with DJ Mike supported by School Council. Rainbow Day coming up June 24th.
- Plantables: As of June 13th 27 orders placed of \$173. There were 40 orders in 2021.

- <u>Garden</u>: Natalie gave an update on Spring planting activity 1st time since pandemic planting with students. Accommodated 3 classes lottery used to choose classes. Students had fun, some new gardeners, excited to contribute a lasting impact on school. 4 butterfly bushes planted as part of staff appreciation too.
- Equity: Jeny Nussey gave update that budget spent on books for each classroom, reproduced posters. Equality donation cheque of \$1,000 to another school with low LOI (learning opportunity index). Mme Bettas indicated that Community Outreach payment of \$700 made to Red Cross as voted by Grade 6s and targeted for Ukraine.
- <u>Pizza Lunch</u>: last pizza lunch of the year yesterday another huge success with over \$1,500 net, 399 students ordered. Papa Johns working well now. Teachers handing out pizza and helping has been a lot easier and smoother than requirement of a lot of parent volunteers.

Treasurer's Update

Jeny - Highlights of 2021-2022 Budget

- Exec voted to increase budget to support DJ for play day.
- A lot more fundraising made possible than expected. Thank you to everyone who picked-up and ran with these

- Budgeted earnings of \$18,000 and we earned \$33,000 (without recent pizza lunch numbers).
- Still budgeted money to be spent this school year.
- Julie asked about Lisa Docherty Spirit Award Ms. Meddick indicated need to pick-up some gift cards.
- Jeff expressed appreciation for Natalie's expense reporting accuracy for Garden Committee.
- Next Monday, June 20th Visiting Artists virtual performance for all students (12:30-1:30pm) and Mr. Mason bought some books for integrated arts supplies.
- Jeff gave a summary of projected cash flow.
- Expecting to go into September with \$34,396 in the bank.
