- important to get children to think about privacy and online reputation

- when children are being targeted, do not take their devices away this is the number one reason why some children do not want to tell parents about cyberbullying

Food Drive - scheduled around Ramadan (in March) and donations made to the Daily Bread Food Bank - please reach out if you have any ideas or want to help

Treasurer Update

- Starting Balance as of Nov 21 \$39, 680.86
- Bank balances shared for Math Up Program, pizza lunch program, yoga, holiday party expenses, Kindie special projects, etc.
- Ending Balance as of today \$31, 555. 63
- Budget vs. Actuals were shared we are in good shape for this year
- we do have an extra \$900 to allocate to the Equity Committee
- Julie motioned to increase the Equity budget by \$900 and Jeny seconded it
- members voted 14 voted for this increase (combined online and in-person)

Vice Principal's and Principal's Report

VPs report

- added another food day providing 350 lunches per week 3 times per week
- last year there were a number of racial incidents last year and they must be put into a TDSB portal but there was not a response to all entries from last year; this year 2-3 entries and responses were received

by superintendents asking what supports are needed - school was offered an equity coach and admin met with the coach (from the Centre for Black Excellence) - she suggested the <u>Sankofa resource</u> - come with books for students and lesson plans for educators and they will be put into the library and it will be mandatory for teachers to sign these books out for their classes - also the Awesome Table (K-3) will be taking place which involved invitations for hands-on, loose parts activities; also Indigenous resources purchased. Teachers have received in-house PD and equity coach has worked closely with Ms. Nason to develop lesson plans to be used alongside the purchased resources

Principal's Report

- 3 fire alarms have been conducted as well as a lock-down drill (partnered with Toronto Police)
- Scholastic book fair went well great idea to have it with movie night
- Boys Volleyball; girls volleyball tryouts; hockey team tryouts (results will be displayed tomorrow)
- visit to Malvern CI (Kindies and Grade 4/5s) to see seasonal performance
- AB Winter Concert went well; sing-a-long occurred the following day and was great
- Lunar New Year parade happening on January 29
- reports are going home February 11 and then teachers will reach out if they would like an interview families can ask teacher if they would like an interview even if the teacher has not reached out
- cold weather kids still really want to get outside; school is monitoring daily temperatures and adjusting accordingly; a few days there was no morning recess and classes made great use of the activity bags; hopefully going back to normal soon - game-day decision; board policy is between -21 and -28 when schools should be keeping students inside
- Williamson Road FI program is over capacity and some families have been offered placement here at Adam Beck will likely will result in increase in JK,FI population here at Adam Beck (ideally sorted out by September so that it doesn't impact the reorg) could mean bussing
- More information to come in February re: making changes suggested by parents at council meetings
